



## NOTICE FROM THE CITY OF MAYWOOD

**June 30, 2020 at 12:00 p.m.:**

Last week saw a rise in the number of cases reported in the County of Los Angeles, with over 2,000 new cases on five separate days. On Sunday, June 28, Governor Newsom ordered in Los Angeles and six other counties to close due to rising COVID-19 cases. On Monday, June 29, the County of Los Angeles issues an order for the temporary closure of all public beaches, piers, beach bike paths, and access points in L.A. County. Also prohibits all firework shows and events until further notice. Beyond the bar closure, neither the County nor the City has taken additional steps to slow or reverse their reopening.

There has been observed a sharp increase in new cases and hospitalizations all over the county. The timing of these increases is in line with the reopening of key sectors, including bars, which are places where people remove their face covering to drink while they may be socializing with people outside of their households. The State mandated closing comes as the Department of Public Health is reporting significant increase in COVID-19 hospitalizations and testing positivity rate.

Today, Public Health has confirmed **2,903** new confirmed cases of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in one day, bringing us to a total of **612** confirmed cases overall in the City of Maywood. Due to patient confidentiality, no further information on the identity of the residents has been released by the LADPH authorities.

Maywood residents are urged to follow physical distancing and infection control directives and wear a clean cloth face covering that securely covers both your nose and mouth when in contact with other people in your household.

We strongly encourage all to do the following

1. Wear a mask! - Wearing a face covering is perhaps the easiest way to keep safe by limiting each other's droplets and reducing the spread. It is required.
2. Avoid social gatherings outside of your immediate household- Large groupings or parties increase the likelihood of spreading COVID-19. Please resist the temptation to gather with people outside your household, particularly over celebratory holidays (**Fourth of July**)
3. Continue to practice physical distancing and regular hand washing.
