



Notice from the City of Maywood

July 13, 2020 at 2:00 p.m.:

The County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health (LADPH) announced THREE THOUSAND, THREE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-TWO (3,322) new confirmed novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in one day, bringing us to a total of **SEVEN HUNDRED AND FORTY-ONE (741)** confirmed cases overall in the City of Maywood. Due to patient confidentiality, no further information on the identity of the residents has been released by the LADPH authorities.

California is [monitoring COVID-19 closely](#) in each local community and keeping the public informed.

Effective July 13, 2020, ALL counties must close indoor operations in these sectors:

- Dine-in restaurants
- Wineries and tasting rooms
- Movie theaters
- Family entertainment centers (for example: bowling alleys, miniature golf, batting cages and arcades)
- Zoos and museums
- Cardrooms

Additionally, bars, brewpubs, breweries, and pubs must close all operations both indoor and outdoor statewide. Counties that have remained on the County Monitoring List for 3 consecutive days will be required to shut down the following industries or activities unless they can be modified to operate outside or by pick-up.

- Fitness centers
- Worship services
- Protests
- Offices for non-essential sectors
- Personal care services, like nail salons, body waxing and tattoo parlors
- Hair salons and barbershops
- Malls
